

Outdoor Watering Updates

Saddle Creek is on the Fulton County Water system so we follow the guidelines set by this agency. Below is an excerpt of important changes. All other watering restrictions are still in place. Visit the Fulton County Water website for more information at www.co.fulton.ga.us or call (404)612-7400.

- Residents can hand-water outdoors only one day per week, for a period of only 25 minutes between midnight and 10 a.m., on an odd-even schedule. Even-numbered addresses may water on Saturday only, and odd-numbered addresses may water on Sunday only. Hand-watering is defined as one person with one garden hose, using a spray nozzle that automatically shuts off when released.
- Residents can water newly installed landscaping for a 30-day period, but <u>must obtain a one-time exemption</u> permit from the EPD by applying at <u>www.urbanagcouncil.com</u>. The permit (\$4.95 online) must be posted in plain sight. If you wish to apply for free in person, call 1-800-ASK-UGA1 for an Extension office location.
- Residents and HOAs can fill outdoor swimming pools (as allowed by the state exemption proposal).
